Year 12: At the end of Term 3, Year 12 students have finished their coursework and are well into revision for final exams; they are rapidly approaching the end of their time at Aitken and the beginning of the next chapter in their lives. I commend all Year 12 students for the way they have approached their academic work during the last term. I also highly commend the group for their excellent and positive leadership of the Aitken College student body. This can be a stressful time in the lives of Year 12 students and their families.

Parents of Year 12 students are encouraged to be understanding during this very stressful time. It is only with the full and active support of the family that a student can perform at their very best. When looking for ways to help your children through this period, you might like to consider the following points:

- *This is an emotionally charged time. If you sense your child is getting stressed, they may need a little space and opportunity to let off some steam on their own; crowding them, if they are feeling this way, will only contribute to their stress.*
- *Your child might want to talk. In this case your job is to listen, resisting the natural urge to offer advice. Often a stressed child will want to unwind by just telling someone about what they are feeling and going through; if your child feels this way, try and be an empathic listening partner.*
- *Try to forgive or tactically ignore minor indiscretions. A child under the enormous pressure of final exams will not always behave perfectly.*
- *When a guiding hand is needed, be positive. You will recognise when your child isn't applying themselves to their work properly. If you see this happening, try to encourage them by helping them set study goals and put some rewards in place for good work. Being angry or badgering will only make the situation worse.*



Humanities News

There is no doubt about it, we are in full swing of climate change. Australia has seen its hottest winter on record, with an average increase of two degrees across the season. As we have seen in the west Atlantic, warmer ocean temperatures produce more hurricanes, such as Harvey and Irma, which have caused destruction across the area. Tropical storms are named alphabetically, with the first storm of the year starting with the letter A. Male names and female names are alternated and are reused every six years. The names of deadly storms are retired and not used again. Andrew, Katrina, Ivan and Mitch are among the retired names. From this year, Harvey and Irma will be retired. Hurricanes, cyclones and typhoons are all the same thing - 'tropical cyclones' - but are given different names depending on where in the world they form.



At Aitken, we look at these phenomena across the year levels in Geography. In Year 7, students look at the use of water in our world and why people live where they do. In Year 8, students look at different landforms and the rise of large cities. In Year 9, students look at biomes and tourism. In Year 10, students investigate climate change directly. Geography is a subject that will become more and more important as international environmental concerns become more pronounced.

Pleasingly, she was named one of three winners on the day and this will see her compete against eleven other students in the State Final in October. No doubt the competition will be tough and she will find herself up against some of Victoria's most talented junior public speakers, but I am sure she will represent Aitken College with poise.



Visual Arts News

Galway Art Workshop: Six students studying Year 9 Art in Semester 2 were invited to attend the Galway Art Workshop on 29 August at Hume Grammar. The number of participants was limited to 20 and each Galway school was invited to bring a small group.

Nicholas Jones is a paper sculptor who uses old books to create beautiful artworks that are folded, carved, sewn and torn. His work is a celebration of the value of books and literature. He uses books and paper to question the future of the written word, as well as to express his love of old books, art and literature. Many of the books he collects and uses are no longer wanted, so he gives them a new meaning and life. Nicolas was born in 1974 in the United Kingdom and now lives and works in Melbourne as an artist and teacher.

After a quick introduction and welcome, students were invited to look at and handle his paper sculptures. Nicholas talked about his methods of carving with a scalpel (his father was a surgeon), and he showed students four ways to fold the pages. Following a hive of activity students experimented with their folding techniques in a paperback book and after lunch they could choose to make a folded book with a hard cover or produce a book worm.

The day was a huge success; the finished books have been on display as a collaborative installation at Hume Grammar. Later this year Aitken students will receive their books to take home. The photos here show some of Nicholas' work and the student's work in progress. Coincidentally, Mrs Camilleri has been working with the whole Year 9 Art class on paper sculpture using old books, so when the students returned to school a brief presentation was given to the whole class to explain some new and different techniques that can be used.



I am hoping to engage Nicholas as an Artist in Residence next year, if any one has any books, old or new, paper back or hard cover that you would like to donate to the Art Department it would be greatly appreciated.


