From the Principal

Sport at Aitken: It came to my attention recently that some parents, particularly in the Primary school, are not aware of the opportunities that Aitken College offers in sport. When students reach Years 5 and 6, the College participates in weekly sport on Fridays with local primary schools; a range of team and individual sports are offered and winners can progress to higher levels. From Year 7 to Year 12, Aitken participates in the School Sports Victoria secondary schools sporting program; we field teams in a wide variety of sports and teams and individuals can progress all the way to the State Championships as indeed some have in recent years. SSV competition enables our most successful students and teams to compete at a high level. These sporting events take place during the school day. From its foundation, Aitken College has encouraged families to keep students involved in local community sport as this is a valuable part of community involvement for all children; as we know, local sporting clubs are the life of the community. It is always exciting to hear of our students performing well in local sport and of many who are team captains and even coaches.

Scholarships at Aitken: Three scholarships are available for Aitken students. The Foundation Scholarship is open to students currently in Year 11 and considers academic achievement, leadership and community service. The Parents & Friends Arts Scholarship is open to students in Year 11 and will contribute to funding a short course or masterclass for students in the visual or performing arts. The Rachel Woodhams Music Scholarship is open to students in Year 8 or Year 9 and will contribute to funding a short course or masterclass in singing and/or songwriting. Applications for these three scholarships must be submitted by the last day of Term 3; details are available from the Principal's office. Students have been spoken to about these opportunities in school assemblies.

NAPLAN Results

Student Reports detailing individual student results from the NAPLAN tests held in May for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 were made available by VCAA (Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority) and mailed to parents last week. Parents of students in these year levels should soon receive a Student Report, which gives details about a student's performance in each area of reading, writing, language conventions and numeracy and an explanatory brochure. Please note, however, that a small number of students were absent for all tests or new to the school since May and therefore did not receive a report.

From the Deputy Principal

Myki Cards: Thank you to the many parents who have supported efforts across the start of the term in ensuring students have tapped on their Myki Card when using the public bus service. We have come across a number of students who, on a daily basis, need to top up with the bus driver, slowing down the boarding process. Asking the students to carry money with them can be fraught with temptation. It is relatively simple to register a Myki and then set up an automatic top-up. Parents can also then easily see where and when your children are travelling and need not worry about the money being spent elsewhere. I encourage all parents to do this.

Parents Contacting Students Throughout the Day: A reminder that any contact of students throughout the day needs to come through Reception. Parents should not be contacting students directly, nor dropping off things to classrooms. School lunches, library books, homework or sports bags should be delivered to Reception where students will be called to collect them. The first point of contact after Reception is Homeroom teachers, Heads of School in Primary and Assistant Heads of School or Heads of House in Secondary.

Traffic: A reminder again about the traffic regulations including the request that only families living in Providence Estate drop off and pick up in there. Students and parents should not be parking along Positano Grove and council parking officers will issue infringements. Please be respectful to our parking attendants. There have been some issues of intimidation from parents/guardians who are not following instructions which are in place to keep students safe and keep the traffic moving. There are only three places for drop off and pick up: the main parent (western) car park, the gym (eastern) car park or the ring road, where cars must not be left unattended and drop off is only ever on the left-hand (footpath) side of the road.
