## Dunhelen School Notices

Welcome back to Semester 2. I trust that students had a relaxing and enjoyable break. I hope that families were able to enjoy some time together without the everyday routines of school life.

Reports were available on the last day of Term 2. I mentioned to students in assembly this week, that I hope that they have looked through the report with their parents and have reflected on what areas they need to work on. Students were reminded that Homework Club will be recommencing next week and that Maths Assist is also available to them. Students should feel free to attend these lunchtime sessions or make appointments to meet with their teachers if they feel they need a little more assistance.

Dunhelen will be electing new Class Captains for Semester 2. I encourage students to consider nominating themselves for this role. Leadership roles allow students to grow and develop their confidence and are also a wonderful opportunity to be involved in the life of the College. Thank you to all Semester 1 Class Captains; they did an excellent job.

Please ensure your child is arriving to school in correct school uniform. Students should be wearing their blazer to and from school everyday and parkas are only to be worn over blazers, not as an alternative to the blazer. Make up and nail polish are not permitted and the only piercings permitted are one plain stud or sleeper per earlobe. Please also ensure that your child is not attending school in PE uniform, unless they have PE first period. Please do not issue your child with a note for incorrect uniform unless it is truly valid, your assistance with this is appreciated.

Getting to school on time is very important and sets the tone for the whole day. Students should be at school by 8.45am, ensuring that students meet these types of time lines assists them in their life generally. If a student is consistently late they will often miss important instruction for the day, they will feel rushed and hurried to 'catch up' to their Homeroom and it can be disruptive to students who are already prepared to start work. Students should be getting out of bed every morning with enough time to get themselves ready, eat a healthy breakfast and get to school on time; this is a life lesson that will serve them well as they get older. If your child is late to school they should proceed directly to Reception and obtain a late slip.

This term the Homework Club will continue at lunchtimes on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Please encourage your child to use this time. I know that many students have out of school commitments and this is an opportunity for them to ask questions and complete work.

## **Cumberland School Notices**

The students returned full of enthusiasm to catch up with friends, classmates and their teachers. They have settled in very quickly and are now actively engaging in their new units of work.

**Data Analysis:** Last term, students were assessed using the Australian Council of Educational Research tests: PAT Reading and PAT Maths. The data from these tests is used to inform our teaching programs. Towards the end of Term 2, staff across Years P-6 were taken off class for a few periods in order to work together with the Curriculum Coordinators and Heads of Schools to analyse the data. We looked at the results for each year level to determine areas of strength and those we would like to focus on for improvement. From the time spent together, staff created action plans for each year level with an aim to target specific areas for greater attention to improve the learning outcomes for our students. These tests will be administered again in November. At this time, we will look for improvement in the focus areas identified in the May tests and again develop new action plans for the following year.

Research has shown that using data in instructional decisions can lead to improved student performance (Wayman, 2005; Wayman, Cho, & Johnston, 2007; Wohlstetter, Datnow & Park, 2008). While this is certainly true, data is not the only or best measure of student progress. In our case, we are using data to identify areas we need to do more work on, identify areas that students are performing well in and to test if strategies and resources we use are helping us to achieve better outcomes for our students. Class tests, observations, quizzes and practical demonstrations of skill ensure we look at a wide range of skills and knowledge development that multiple choice tests cannot assess. When we get information from a wide range of sources, we can get a better understanding of each child's learning stage and we are better able to target instruction where it is needed.

**Friendship Issues:** Friendships are often difficult for children as they often do not have the knowledge, understanding or skill to understand the dynamics of the situation. Also, as students move through the school they all grow and develop at different rates, change interests, change activities and often change friends. So, at any stage, friendships can become an issue for children. The question I am most often asked is how can parents support their children when this is occurring.

The first thing I would advise is to support your child by:

- Letting them know this is difficult to deal with and everyone goes through this in life - they are not alone or different.
- Let them know that while you are supporting them, it is their issue to deal with. Just like riding a bike, there will be bruises to start with but eventually they will develop the skill.
- Encourage them to think of strategies/approaches they might use (Do not tell them they need to work this out for themselves, otherwise they will never get the skills they need and they will not be able to deal with future issues).
- Talk to them about the qualities a good friend has and ask if the other person is being a good friend. If they are not perhaps it is time to find new friends.
- Talking to them about why they want the other person as a friend - sometimes they idolise others and want to be in that friendship group, even when it is not in their best interests. Again, go back to what a good friend looks like and how they make them feel.
- Work with them to complete a list of qualities they would like to have in their ideal friend. For me a friend must be.....
- Discuss how they feel when they are with their friends; if it is not good, they should walk away.
- Talk about what kind of a friend they are. Do they have the same qualities they listed? Do they make their friends feel good? Do they constantly argue with or boss their friends? Sometimes self-reflection really helps them see themselves from their friend's perspective.
- Discuss the idea of having many friends, not just one BFF. Let them know that it can take years and years to find a BFF.
- Remind them that they need to only address their own issues and not take sides or take on anyone else's problems. These people need to learn how to solve their own issues as well.

- Parents who model this well and explain the approach well to their children often have children who are more capable of dealing with issues when they arise. Their issues are short lived, only involve them and the other person and do not result in the problem spreading to others, escalating or taking forever to resolve.
- Follow the rule: ‘The only way to have a good friend is to be one!’



**Indonesian Study Tour 2017:** For the first 10 days of the mid-year holidays, 17 Aitken students from Years 9-12 and four members of staff participated in Aitken College's biennial trip to Indonesia. This was the seventh time we have travelled to South East Asia and our fourth trip to Indonesia. We visited the capital city of Indonesia, Jakarta, then travelled overland through Java stopping at Bandung and Jogjakarta. We then flew to Bali and stayed at the town of Ubud, known as the cultural center of Bali.

A highlight of the trip was visiting the school of Tarakanita in central Java where students had the opportunity to meet students their own age. Students from both schools performed various musical items and the Indonesian students were excited to receive lessons in AFL football and the art of boomerang throwing from our students.

Other activities on the trip included visiting many cultural landmarks and participating in activities such as *angklung* playing (bamboo musical instrument), *gamelan* playing (Indonesian percussion) and traditional Javanese dancing. I commend the students who participated for their attitude towards all aspects of the trip. They embraced the many opportunities afforded them to practice their language skills and immerse themselves in Indonesian culture and history which is not generally possible in a classroom environment.
