Brookhill School Notices

Year 11 Presentation Ball: Dance lessons will start on Monday 16 May, in preparation for the annual Year 11 Presentation Ball, to be held on Saturday 27 August. Students will once again be under the guidance of dance teacher, Mr Sebastian Riscica and will have ten lessons and a full day rehearsal at Moonee Valley on Thursday 25 August. There will be three dance practice time slots: Mondays 3.30pm to 4.40pm; Wednesdays 2.10pm to 3.10pm and Wednesdays 3.30pm to 4.30pm. Participating students will receive notification shortly of which session they are allocated to. Invitations for families to attend the Ball will be mailed to families towards the end of term. Tickets will be purchased through Trybooking online booking; detailed instructions of booking procedure will also be mailed to families.

Mid-Year Exams: Mid-year exams are approaching. Year 10 and Year 11 exams will take place from Monday 6 June to Friday 10 June. The GAT for all students studying a Unit 3-4 subject is on Tuesday 7 June. It is very important that all students make mid-year exams their highest priority over this period of time. The exam timetable is quite tight and students will have more than one exam on a day on some occasions. This means that Year 10 and 11 students will have to prioritise study over the next few weeks. Organisational skills and forward planning will be important; study cannot be left to the night before an exam, particularly if there are two exams on a particular day.

I strongly encourage all parents to talk to their children about their preparation for the upcoming exams. At this stressful time, students need loving support and gentle encouragement from their families; parents should focus on helping children to achieve their own personal best performance. The following advice from Elevate Education, who provide Study Skills education to Aitken College is pertinent.

Notes should be complete at least 2 weeks before the exam. You need good notes for final preparation, but making notes in the last couple of weeks is less effective. Elevate recommends the following process for effective use of notes:

1. Write notes.
2. Review notes within minutes of completing them.
3. Review the same notes after 24 hours.
4. Review the same notes twice in that week.

Use colour in your notes and use key trigger words to aid memory recall. Do not try and memorise large chunks of notes, but develop recall techniques around trigger words and phrases and colour.

VCAL News

The VCAL students have been very busy planning and implementing a number of projects for Numeracy. Year 12 VCAL students are currently designing a house, learning about timber framing techniques by constructing 1/8 scale models of timber house frames and naming the different components. The students have been able to explore mathematics beyond its familiar and everyday use to its application outside their immediate personal environment such as at the College and at the workplace. The mathematics involved includes measurement, graphs and simple statistics, scale drawings and an understanding of the use of formulae and problem-solving strategies.

The Year 11 VCAL class have constructed a basic four-wheeled solar car which is driven by an electric motor and powered by a purpose-designed solar panel. The power to the wheels is transferred from the motor by gears. The solar panel consists of two sections, each of 1.5 Volts and 0.2 Amps, which can be connected in series or parallel. Students designed an individual vehicle to suit their own needs.

Chaplain's Corner

This term in Senior Chapel, I will be focusing on relationships; what is needed to help them work and what to do when things break down. Relationships are the number one sustainer in life. My Year 6 RVE students last term were reflecting on what it means to belong; their wisdom needs to be shared.

- *To help others feel like they belong you need to help them feel comfortable and feel like you enjoy their company.*
- *I would be sad and lonely if I did not have any friends and I would not want to go to school anymore.*
- *A group rejected me: when I went to the bathroom one day, when I came out my group of friends had run away from me. It took me 10 minutes to try and find them when I did they acted like nothing happened. I felt like "what are they doing?" Then later that day I wanted to tell someone something and they said I wasn't allowed to come. I felt excluded. I told them that I felt excluded but they didn't care. We are still friends but that day haunts me every day.*
- *I was in Year 5 and my usual friends were away and I didn't have anyone to spend lunch with. I saw a group of girls and went over to play with them. I sat down next to them and tried to join their conversation but they sort of ignored me. I tried again but they still ignored me so I just got up and left to play down ball against the wall by myself. I was quite sad that day because I thought it would be easy to join a group.*
- *I feel that belonging is something people cannot live without; the feeling of being a part of a group that treats and protects you like a family is incredible and nothing can beat it!*

Friends are the number one glue that bind us to any group. When your child says "I have no friends" or "my friends are mean to me" or any such comment that lets you know they are not enjoying their friends, it is not something to ignore. Your child is asking for help. For children, having a good group of friends is vital for their understanding of who they are, it helps them to feel safe, cared for and lets them know that they belong.

Music News



Instrumental Music Tuition: *Answers to parents' concerns about classroom "pull out".* The scheduling of music lessons during the busy school day can be quite a challenge. Many schools, like Aitken, schedule students on a weekly rotating basis: one week your child leaves his or her first period class for instrument lessons, the following week music lessons take place during the second period class, and so on. Parents often express concern that the loss of this classroom time will have a detrimental effect on their child's academic performance. Several studies have addressed their concern.


Edward J. Kvet of Loyola University studied over 2000 students in four different school districts and discovered that children who were removed from class to study music did not demonstrate any decrease in their reading, language, and math abilities as compared to their non-musical schoolmates. (*Excusing Elementary School Students from Regular Classroom Activities for the Study of Instrumental Music: The Effect on Sixth-Grade Reading, Language, and Mathematics Achievement*)

Parents need not worry that missed class time due to music instruction will adversely affect their child's report card. In fact, teachers and parents may well observe that music participation leads to greater success with other academic pursuits.

NAPLAN Testing

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an assessment program for all students in Australian schools in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 which tests knowledge and skills in Literacy and Numeracy. It has been held annually in Australian schools since 2008. The results of the tests provide information for students, parents, teachers and principals about student achievement which can be used to support teaching and learning programs.

In 2016, the NAPLAN tests will be held on the following dates:

Tuesday 10 May	Language Conventions and Writing tests
Wednesday 11 May	Reading tests
Thursday 12 May	Numeracy tests

Students who are absent on these dates can only undertake catch-up tests if they are at school on Friday 13 May. I would encourage parents to ensure that all students are at school on the dates listed above, unless the students are too unwell to attend, so that parents and teachers receive results for the relevant students.

NAPLAN tests fundamental skills rather than specific content, and as such is not a test for which students can study or drill. The best way you can help your child prepare for NAPLAN is to let them know that NAPLAN is just one part of their school program, and to urge them to simply do the best they can on the day. The use of services by coaching providers is not recommended.

Please note that all students in Years 7 and 9 will need to use a calculator for some sections of the Numeracy tests. There are strict rules in force regarding the use of the calculators during the NAPLAN test. Any breach of these rules will be handled according to the ACARA (Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority) NAPLAN guidelines for cheating. Please note that students are NOT allowed to use the calculator functions or apps on iPads for NAPLAN testing. Further information about the calculator requirements for NAPLAN tests will be sent to parents of students in Years 7 and 9 shortly.

Parent reports provide detailed information about the results of each student on the testing days in Literacy and Numeracy, showing how each student's achievement level compares to others in Australia. The results do take some time to arrive and are provided by government bodies - generally they are available by the end of Term 3. More information about the results will be provided in due course.



Many of the younger children have requested that we make butterflies' and to make it more interesting, we made it a science experiment by making chromatography butterflies. The experiment involves separating different components of a chemical mixture. The children dipped only the corners of their paper towel into the mixture and watched as the dye was absorbed by the paper towel and the chemicals that make up the colour of the dye separated on it. This reaction was perfect for the colour effect we wanted for our butterflies' paper wings. The results were very effective and we finished off the butterfly by bunching the paper towel and fixing it with a pipe cleaner or a peg, whichever the children preferred, for a body. Then we added pipe cleaners for antennas.

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
