## From the Principal

**Leadership Opportunities:** This week I spoke at Brookhill Assembly encouraging Year 11 students to nominate for College Leadership positions for 2017. I spoke about the importance of focussing on what they could contribute to a leadership team in 2017. The College Leaders, must be visible leaders within the College community and must lead by example, having pride in their school. They must endeavour to be available to others and to be willing to give of their time. The process is one of selection where students are required to give a short speech at assembly, consideration given to students and staff voting and their performance at an interview with the Principal, Deputy Principal and the current College Captains.

**Scholarships:** The Aitken College Foundation Scholarship is an initiative of the College Board to encourage a full time enrolled student in their Year 12 academic year. This scholarship is open to all current Year 11 students who need to complete an application form and attend an interview. The criteria to be addressed in applying for the scholarship includes academic performance, participation in the wider life of the College, leadership and community service.

The Parents and Friends Association fund a Parent and Friends Arts Scholarship(s) for full time students enrolled in their Year 12 academic year. This scholarship funds, in full or in part, an approved study program in the area of the Arts for a student who has demonstrated creative work in Performing or Visual Arts.

The Rachael Woodhams Music Scholarship supports a student who demonstrates a talent and potential in singing and/or music composition with the opportunity to participate in a formal course or master class that meets the objectives of the scholarship. Applicants must be in Year 8 or Year 9.

All scholarship application forms are available at Reception and are due by the end of Term 3.

It is crucial our children's privacy is respected and protected.

**Fairview Concert:** This year all of the Fairview students will be performing in their annual concert incorporating music, dance and drama. This year the theme and title of the show is 'Better When I'm Dancing'. There will be two performances, the first on **Tuesday 13 September** and the second on **Thursday 15 September**. Both shows will begin at **6.30pm**. Performances will be in the Chapel and Performing Arts Centre at Aitken College.

For the performances, students are to report to their class teacher by **5.45pm** at the following locations; Prep (room P5), Year 1 (room P17) and Year 2 (room P6). Students will be supervised by classroom teachers throughout the concert and can then be collected from their allocated room at the concert's conclusion. The students performing in the concert do not require a ticket. Tickets will be on sale from Friday 26 August. Tickets will not be available at the door and must be pre-booked. Please note you will need to print out your own tickets when booking. Please refrain from leaving empty seats beside your booking and note that building regulations require all audience members over the age of 18 months occupy their own seat.

The taking of video and photographs during the performance is not allowed. This becomes distracting to other audience members and the children performing.

At Aitken College, acquiring skills in all aspects of performance is important and the teachers aim to teach audience members to display appropriate theatre etiquette. We hope that you will support us in this endeavour and ensure that your children follow the required protocol and display skills as a polite audience member or performer.

## Chaplain's Corner

**The Triumph of Humility:** One of the most moving moments of the Olympic Games was the men's Fijian Rugby 7s receiving their gold medals from Princess Anne. After thrashing Great Britain 43 to 7, Fiji had every right to celebrate their victory by parading and gloating in their glory. But this was so not the case! Instead, the champions sang praises to God and offered prayers of thanks for their victory.

If that was not modest enough already, the supreme Fijian athletes went from standing strong and proud on the podium celebrating their countries first ever Olympic medal, to each player, one by one, kneeling on the podium to receive their medal in a position of humility. What was it about this gesture that moved me to tears? It did not take long to identify the paradox; the ones who deserved to be praised and adored were the very ones who were bowing down in a sign of deep respect, raising them, in my mind, to a very high status indeed.

Jesus said “Many who are first will be last, and the last will be first.” (Mark 10:31). Jesus came to challenge the way his society diminished, marginalised and neglected its least. He objected to the religious institution of his day that were more interested in their own power and status than seeking a just and peaceful society. Jesus’ message remains as important as ever today.

The deep respect shown by the Fijian Rugby 7s was a glimpse of what humility and grace can offer our society. Moved by these men, I prayed that they might be for us all, a lasting example of what it means to be GREAT!


